PhD students: majority spends > 3 months abroad

## Swedish students' general situation

#### *Year 1-5*





- No tuition
- 950 USD/month (9 months)
   (25% gift, 75% loan)
- Mostly courses (4.5 years)
- Master thesis: 20 weeks in the end

- Employed
- Full social benefits, pension...
- 1600-2100 USD/month
- Working full-time on funded research project
- National, international and private funding sources

## Swede going to Japan



- Courses:
  - Language barrier (programs like JYPE help)
    Valid in Swedish curriculum
- Master thesis project
- Economical support generally possible
- PhD students: if relevant for thesis work

### Japanese going to Sweden

#### academic



- Courses:
  - Most courses can be given in English from year 3.
- Project:
  - Possible in laboratories (from short to one year)

    Must fit in PhD/Master project

#### economical

- Housing:
  - 40000 JPY/month (MS: possible to get half year free
- Food:
  - Expensive if not cooking yourself (most Swedes do)
- 10000 JPY/month gives unlimited local transportation
- Insurance from home country
