

The 19th International Students / Young Birds Seminar on Multi-scale Flow Dynamics in ICFD2023

General Information

Information

We are pleased to announce that “The Nineteenth International Students/Young Birds Seminar on Multi-scale Flow Dynamics (hereinafter referred to as OS21)” session will be held **in a face-to-face format** for students and young researchers **who are 35 years old or younger**. This year, participants will be engaging in both face-to-face Poster Presentations and Short Oral Presentations. Specific information is provided below.

1. Session Style

The OS21 will be divided into three sections: 15:10-17:20 on Nov. 6, 10:00-12:10 and 13:25-15:35 on Nov. 7. The participants will be assigned in one of the three sections. Within the assigned section, the short presentations will be given in the first 30 minutes, and the poster presentations will be given in the last 90 minutes.

2. Poster Presentation

- ✓ Participants are required to print their posters in advance and bring them to the venue.
- ✓ **The maximum size for posters should be 1,700mm (H) x 900mm (W).**
- ✓ Each section will be divided into first and second halves, and the participants will be designated within one of the time slots.

3. Short Oral Presentation

- ✓ All presentations should be prepared **ONLY in PDF file** (1 slide, Maximum 5 MB).
- ✓ The presentation time is **1 min.**
- ✓ We plan to collect your presentation file by google form. Once we prepare it, we will announce the details. The deadline is planned to be **October 27th**.
- ✓ We will prepare a PC for the short oral presentation. The participants **CANNOT use your PC** on the short oral presentation.

Best Presentation Award for Students Session in OS21

We are planning to award “**Best Presentation Award for Students Session**” to the best presenters in the OS21. All participants at the OS21 session will be eligible to be awarded.
